The Hero of the Match - Vinoo Mankad

If there's one name that must be etched in gold when talking about **India's maiden Test victory against England**, it's **Vinoo Mankad**. The left-arm spinner produced a match-winning performance, picking up **8/55 in the second innings** — a spell that left the English batters helpless on a turning pitch.

In the first innings, he had already taken 4 wickets, making it **12 wickets in the match**. This performance remains one of the most memorable in Indian Test history and firmly established Mankad as one of the world's premier all-rounders at the time.

Batting Backbone – Pankaj Roy and Polly Umrigar

After bowling England out for 266 in the first innings, India needed a solid response with the bat. Openers **Pankaj Roy (111)** and **Polly Umrigar (130 not out)** rose to the occasion. Roy's century was his first in Test cricket and came at a crucial time. Umrigar, who would go on to become one of India's finest batters, played a fluent innings filled with elegant strokes and calm temperament.

India declared their innings at 457, securing a significant lead of 191 runs.

England's Collapse – Spin Does the Trick

In their second innings, England were expected to fight back. But Vinoo Mankad had other plans. Using the turn and bounce available on the dry Madras pitch, he ran through England's middle and lower order. The visitors were bundled out for just 183.

India won the match by an innings and 8 runs, securing their first-ever Test win against **England** and announcing themselves as a rising force in international cricket.
