Australia Edge Past India by 4 Wickets in 2nd T201 Thriller

Despite a late surge from India's bowlers, Maxwell's composure and a steady hand from Tim David ensured Australia crossed the finish line with four wickets in hand and just a couple of balls remaining.

For India, there were positives to take — especially the consistency of their top order and the fighting spirit shown by their bowlers. However, missed chances in the field and a few costly overs at the death proved decisive.

With the series now level, both teams head into the decider with everything to play for. If this game was any indication, cricket fans can expect another high-voltage clash as India and Australia battle for T20 supremacy in the final showdown.
