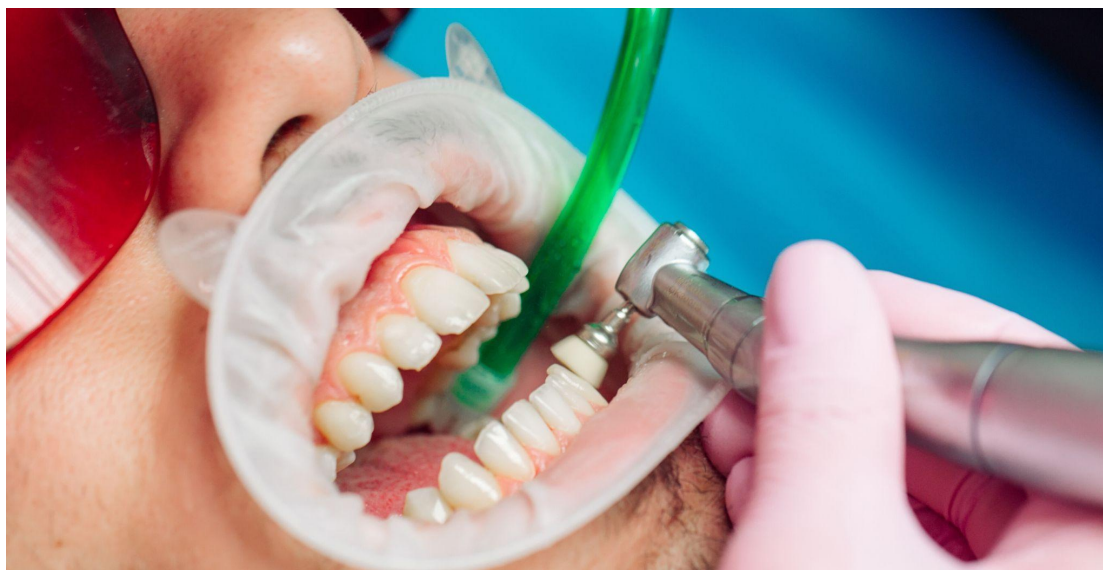


5 Signs You Need a Kennesaw Emergency Dentist Immediately

2. Knocked-Out or Chipped Teeth

Teeth can and do get knocked out or damaged from blunt force trauma, such as sports injuries or falls. You really have to jump on top of it when that happens. If a tooth is lost, you should attempt to save the tooth by gently reinserting it in the socket or placing it in a container with milk or saliva. [Marietta emergency dentist](#) and Kennesaw family dentist explained that often, a knocked-out tooth can be saved if you receive treatment within an hour. A Kennesaw emergency dentist will be able to evaluate the damage and decide if that tooth can be re-implanted, or if a crown or a bridge needs to be put in place.

3. Swelling or Bleeding Gums

Puffy or bleeding gums can indicate gum disease, but also more acute problems such as infection, abscess, or trauma. If there is a lot of bleeding while using ratsak or if it's persistent, persistent (continues) or associated with severe pain,

then you should seek emergency treatment. An emergency dentist in Kennesaw can assess whether you are suffering from an infection, gum disease, or some other serious ailment that should not wait for treatment. Left untreated, it could result in more severe problems, such as infection and tooth loss.

4. Lost or Broken Dental Restorations

A loose crown or filling that is damaged can cause the tooth to be exposed, leaving it susceptible to future injury or infection. When you lose a filling or break a crown, you need to see the Kennesaw emergency dentist right away. Leaving the disease untreated could cause extremely painful, decayed teeth or even necessitate tooth removal.

If you've had a dental procedure recently, a bit of bleeding and swelling is to be expected. But if the bleeding continues for more than a few hours or is abnormally heavy, it can be an early sign of complications such as infection or healing gone wrong.
