Fans React: "Why Drop Arshdeep?"

Social media erupted moments after the playing XI was announced. Many fans felt Arshdeep deserved a place, especially due to his consistency in death overs and ability to swing the new ball.

Common fan reactions included:

- “Arshdeep has been unfairly benched.”
- “Why experiment in such an important series?”

Supporters argued that Arshdeep’s experience should have been preferred over relatively newer options like Harshit Rana.

Why Prasidh and Harshit Were Picked
